

## Local business climate survey - 32 000 reply





An analysis of a data set containing 328 pairs 34.8 percent of procurements have no of a previous and a subsequent procurement. recurring winners.

The results are divided into three categories: **The sum of recurring and partially** 

- Completely repeat winner
- Partially recurring winners
- No repeat winners.

Fully recurring winners in 35.7 percent of procurements,

partially recurring winners in 29.5 percent of procurements,

The sum of recurring and partially recurring winners is 65.2 percent.

## **IPR in public procurement**



In a survey carried out by Confederation of Swedish Enterprise,

It appears that of 197 randomly selected procurements that were advertised in 2022 and that contained the heading "intellectual property"

The authority required ownership over IPR in 93.9 percent of the cases

(not a license or right of use).

Who wants to bid?





- **European preference** in public procurement for critical sectors and technologies.
- Promotion of green technology and digitalization.
- New measures to encourage demand for low-carbon products, such as benchmarking/labelling, mandates or preference in public procurement or financial incentives through contracts for difference.
- Increasing recourse to joint defense procurement.
- Ensure resilience of the supply chains, especially for critical raw materials.
- Joint procurement of critical raw materials to reduce dependencies.
- **Simplification** of reporting requirements for businesses.

## **Digitalization in public procurement**



- would lead to simplifications,
- cost savings,
- better data for analysis and follow-up,
- simpler sustainability reporting,
- increased contractual fidelity,
- a higher degree of automation,
- better opportunities to identify crimes and corruption,
- support for work on security of supply and
- a qualitative data basis for the development of new AI solutions.

## **Main Issues in the Current System**




- Outdated Approach to Digitalization



## **Background – starting point**

Scope of revision

- PP Directives (excluding 2009/81, 89/665/EEC, 92/13/EC)
- + currently around 60 (!!) PP provisions <u>outside</u> the Directives

Highlighting/Analysis of some (!) problems:

## **Modernisation \Leftrightarrow Revision?**

- Revision should aim at "fit for purpose" which includes "modernisation
- Proper analysis needed (for ex: why is competition declining?) multi-causal reasons, not "one (simple) answer for every negative effect"
- unfortunately rushed process time/money/personnel restraints on COMs side
- COM and MS are tasked to decide about purpose of PP <u>before</u> drafting starts (how/what to buy?, political priorities)



## Some personal ideas

- simplify by merging 2014/24 with 2014/25 based on the later
- "clean up" sectoral files, develop templates for regulatory topics (exclusion grounds, common purchases, COM as CPB ....)
- technology neutral approach concerning "emerging technologies"
- flexibilisation + reduction of number of procedures (framework agreements, negotiated procedures)
- better incorporation of "security/crisis concerns" in "civil" procurement
- stay with Directives (= no Regulations)
