The board of governors is the chief executive and generally liable for the activities of the Danish Court Administration. The composition of the Danish Court Administration's board of governors is provided by the Danish Court Administration Act. The board of governors has 11 members, eight of whom are court representatives, one is a lawyer and two have special management and social insights.
