

Ever since the Age of Sail, cargo ships have followed the same operational practice: "Sail Fast, Then Wait" (SFTW).

Eradicating SFTW will allow ships to reduce speed, thereby reducing the carbon footprint of the maritime industry by about 15% or overall 45 million tonnes of CO, across the tanker fleet and bulker fleets, based on figures for 2019.

These reductions in emissions are available today, from the world's current fleet.




Blue Visby Solution

- → Technical solution: algorhythm for route optimization
- Contractual solution: overcome split incentives

SFTW vs. BVS







Technical solution

- → Data analysis on 150 ports and 150,000 bulk ship voyages
- → 87% of the voyages reduction possible without reduction in market capacity
- → Typical savings potential of all analysed voyages is 16%

Blue Visby Protocol

→ Various versions to be incorporated in CP's, b/l's and sales contracts

- Obligations for participants, incl.:
 - → Parties are to become members of BVMA
 - → Vessels to be equipped to receive instructions from BVS software
 - Contractual arrival provisions extended to Blue Line area
 - → ETA to be provided by BVS software
 - Vessel's speed adjusted accordingly
 - → B/I's are to incorporate the Blue Visby framework



Blue GA Rules

- Maritime burden sharing mechanism inspired by general average
- → GA act: when an extraordinary sacrifice or expenditure is intentionally and reasonably made or incurred for the common safety for the purpose of preserving from peril the property involved in a common maritime adventure. (Rule A YAR)





- Unlike GA:
 - → Financial pains and gains are shared (not just pains)
 - → Fuel savings, forfeited demurrage, carbon credits
 - → Other: insurance, ETS?
 - → Equal shares and market rates (not actual values)
 - → Prevents commercial and competition law issues



Blue Visby Mutual Association

- Association for pooling and allocating pains and gains
 - Per voyage and between voyages
- Members bound by contractual force of the association's rules

- → BVMA Rules include:
 - Membership rules, compliance with BVS, administration and management and financing, dispute resolution mechanism
